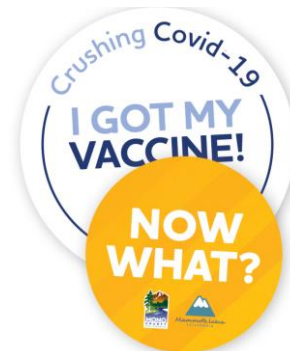




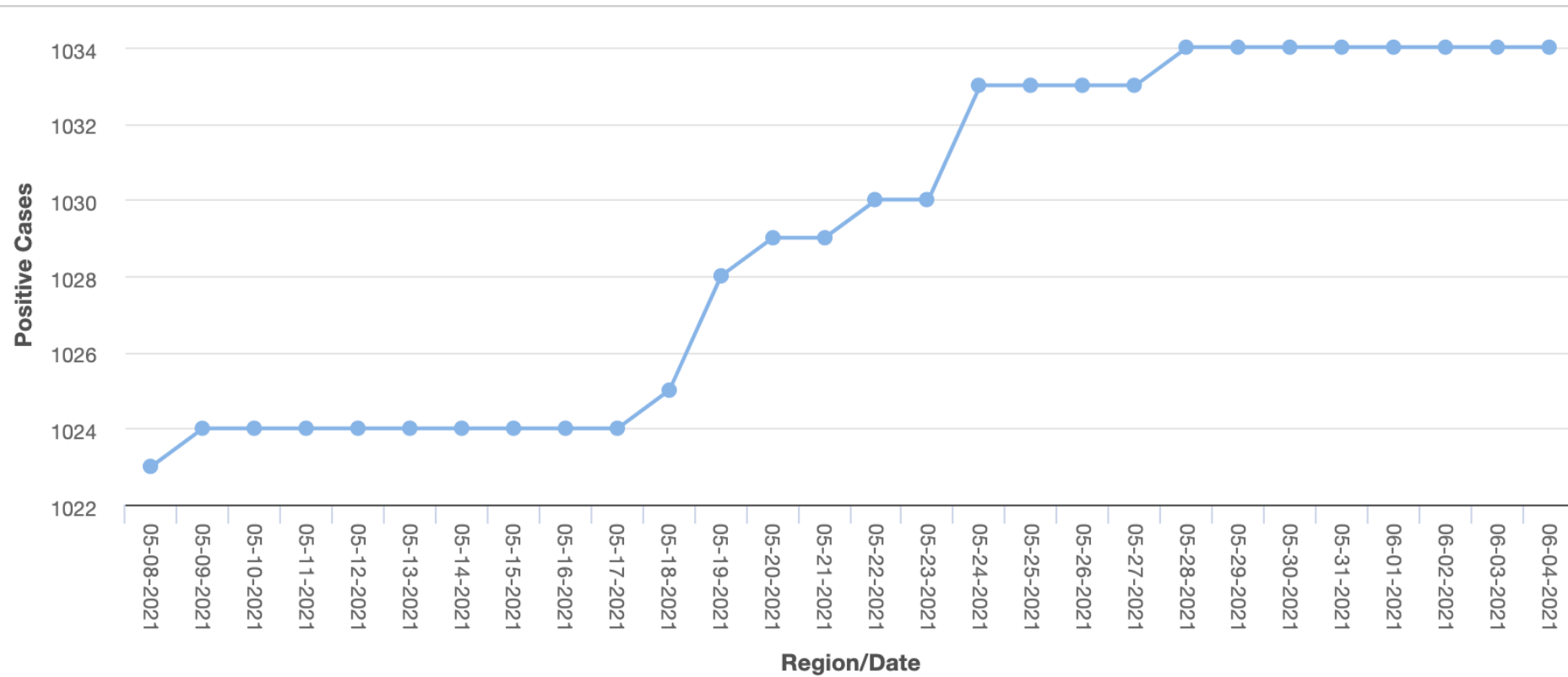

BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY



Metrics:

- Case Rate/100,000: 3.1 (3.0 decrease from previous meeting)
- Testing Positivity rate: 3.5% (0.5% increase from previous meeting)

BEYOND THE BLUEPRINT

When California fully reopens the economy, the state will move beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Beginning June 15, all sectors listed in the current [Blueprint Activities and Business Tiers Chart](#) may return to usual operations (with the limited exceptions noted below for Mega Events) based on the following general public health recommendations:

	Restrictions Applying to Indoor & Outdoor Settings
Vaccine Verification / Negative Testing	Required for Indoor mega events Recommended for Outdoor mega events
Capacity Limitations	No restrictions
Physical Distancing	No restrictions for attendees, customers and guests
Masking	Follow current CDPH Guidance for Face Coverings
Travelers	Follow CDC recommendations and CDPH Travel Advisory

Employers are subject to the [Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards \(ETS\)](#), if applicable to them.

CAL/OSHA COVID-19 PREVENTION EMERGENCY TEMPORARY STANDARDS

The Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board on June 3 readopted Cal/OSHA's revised COVID-19 prevention emergency temporary standards. To better align with state's plan to retire the Blueprint on June 15, the new standards phase out physical distancing and make other adjustments to rules which are no longer required given today's record low case rates and the fact that California has administered 37 million vaccines to date.

The revised emergency standards are expected to go into effect no later than June 15 if approved by the Office of Administrative Law in the next 10 calendar days.

- **Cal/OSHA proposes to continue the face covering requirement indoors and at mega-events, in mixed groups of vaccinated and unvaccinated workers.**
