1. Call to Order: Chair – DonnaLisa Knowles at 1:34PM

2. Introductions

3. Public Comment: Members of the public have the opportunity to address the Council on items of interest within the jurisdiction of the Council. **No Public Comment.**

4. Membership Update:

a. DonnaLisa Knowles made a motion to accept Salvador Montanez's letter of resignation. Jacinda Croissant Second. All in favor. No abstentions. No further discussion. Motion passed. **(Action)**

b. CAPC members reviewed the CAPC Vacancy notice. Molly DesBaillets suggested we place the vacancy notice in the local newspapers as a classified ad. **(Informational)**

5. Approval of December 2, 2020 Minutes: Molly DesBaillets made a motion to approve the December 2, 2020 Meeting Minutes. Michelle Raust second. All in favor. No abstentions. No discussion. Motion passed. **(Action)**



- 6. Innovative Partnership Grant and CAP Month Planning:** CAPC Members heard an update about the Innovative Partnership Grant and information related to CAP Month Planning. The Coordinator shared that she was able to purchase the following items with the Innovative Partnership Grant for CAP Month; Yard signs in English and Spanish, 50 Child Abuse Reporting Car Magnets, materials to enhance the Second Steps social emotional learning toolkit in Spanish and 50 CAP month pins. The Coordinator also shared that current CAP month events; April 2nd wear blue day, all April pass the pinwheel, Intro to Trauma Informed Care on April 15th and the slag Raising Ceremony on April 23rd via Facebook Live Stream. Jacinda Croissant shared that April is also ACE's and PACE's Month and she will be doing an ACE's and PACE's event in April. Details to come at a later date. **(Information)**
- 7. Child Welfare and Covid-19 pandemic:** Michelle Ruast shared a power point presentation with the CAPC members about outcomes and status during the Covid-19 pandemic. **(Informational)**
- 8. Resource Family and Foster Youth Services Updates:** CAPC/ FYSCP Coordinator shared an update that she is still working on the FYSCP Plan that is due May 28th. With the remaining FYSCP fund the Coordinator has partnered with Resilient Colorado to support the EAC's interest in trauma informed schools. Trauma was highlight as the most important training in the need's assessment conducted this fall. This is s two-year contract and we will be bringing a variety of trainings forward. To start we will be doing a Trauma informed care schools 4-hour training on March 25th for CAPC and the EAC. Lastly, we will be doing an intro to trauma informed care on April 15th that is open to anyone. Also with some of FYSCP funds I was able to have 5 people including myself training with a Strengthening Families Program. 2 from social services and 2 from Mammoth Elementary school. SFP sessions include all the critical core components of effective evidence-based parenting programs (CDC, 2008) including: parent and child practice time in the family sessions learning positive interactions, communication, and effective discipline. MUSD will begin a pilot of this program in the coming weeks as it was recently identified at a SARB meeting that an at-risk family would benefit from this program. **(Informational)**
- 9. CAPC Program and Member Updates:** CAPC members and staff have the option to share information related to the mission of the CAPC. **(Informational)**

 - *Molly DesBaillets, First 5 Mono:* The First 5 Programs are transitioning into in person. Specifically, home-visiting. Staff that are fully vaccinated will be able to go into homes. They will continue with virtual visits until everyone is fully vaccinated and based on parents comfort levels. They were also able to verify that First 5 and Safe Kids will be able to hold the 2021 Kindergarten Round Up and Health and Safety Fairs outside this year. The link was added to the chat back and if anyone wants to participate just send Molly and email.



- *Michelle Raust, Mono County Department of Social Services:* Up date from CDSS. There is a resource out there for foster youth, caregivers and former foster youth for crisis management called the Family Urgent Response System (FURS) Management. The intent is to provide a service for those in need as a different option than calling law enforcement and a more trauma informed approach. There is a hotline that is ran by the state to deescalate the situation or dispatch a local FURS staff group to provide intervention.
- *Matthew O'Connor, Wild Iris:* Matthew shared about the Resiliency Symposium coming up at the end of April. CASA has taken the lead on this event. If anyone is interested in getting involved, he suggested you reach out o Barbara Keller. Matthew went on to share that he has had to make a tough decision and step down from his position with Wild Iris and the CAPC at the beginning of June. If you or someone you know is interested, please apply on the Wild Iris website.
- *Jazmin Barkley, Mono County Probation:* No Updates.
- *Jacinda Croissant, Mono County Public Health Department:* Jacinda shared that she is proud to be in Mono County as we have one of the highest vaccination rates in the state. Case rates are low right now and should be transitioning into the red tiered. SIDS she still has 4 pack in plays that might need a safe sleeping space for an infant. In order to receive one, they must watch a SIDS educational video.
- *DonnaLisa Knowles, Parent and Community Member:* No Updates at this time.
- *Courtney Powell, CAPC Coordinator:* Reminded all members that Form 700 is due on April 1st and that she sent out a Child Abuse Prevention Survey out seeking feedback from members. Ethic will be due this summer and she will be sending out a reminder email.
