Wendy,

There are a few things I could quickly pass along by email. I can also try to make the meeting if you think it would worth while.

Sierra Conservation Project provides residential curbside pick-up for June Lake, Lee Vining and Mono City on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday's of the month at \$18/month. Containers are provided with sign-up and additional containers are \$20/each unless you provide your own.

Mammoth Disposal and D&S Waste Disposal, our two permitted Franchisees, do not currently offer residential curbside pickup for recyclables, however, it is being written into the new Franchise Agreement which will take affect July 1st of this year.

There are two locations for California Redemption Value recycling on aluminum, plastic and glass beverage containers; Mammoth Disposal and Walker Senior Center/ Recycling Center (limited operation hours).

Pumice Valley Transfer Station / Landfill is the closest disposal facility for June Lakes. They have recycling bins available for cardboard, plastic, aluminum, glass and metal. There is no redemption value for recycling there. Hours of operation are:

Wednesday 7:30 am - 3:30 pm

Saturday 7:30 am - 3:30 pm

As of the first of this month we signed the Waste Disposal and Recycling Services at Facilities Owner and/or Operated by Mono County with D&S Waste. It has not yet been determined which facilities will be selected for recycling (likely starting in Bridgeport). If there was a reasonable need for recycling bins at the Community Center in June Lake we would review and consider.
