- Food donations needed

- Giveaway items that could encourage participation and some that could be added to the resource bags which will also contain the Narcan.
- -Other community resources should also be provided such as condoms, tobacco cessation resources, fentanyl strips, etc.
- -Inyo has the Narcan tent that can be used at each event.
- -Mono Public health has 150 Narcan boxes and Inyo has a lot that they can distribute as well.
- -Discussed possibly hosting same event with Mountain employees, possibly during employee orientation.
