Mono County: Integrated Case Worker I/II

Location: Mammoth Lakes

Salary: \$24.77-\$33.23/hour

Info: Apply regulations and procedures to determine eligibility of applicants and recipients for multiple public assistance benefits; provide basic employment services to clients; perform casework management duties for both benefit and employment services, and perform related duties as required.

Integrated Case Worker I

Employees in this class attend training sessions and work under close supervision to learn regulations, work procedures, forms, and public assistance and/or employment program requirements. Employees are expected to promote to Integrated Case Worker II after one year of satisfactory performance at the entry level.

Integrated Case Worker II

Employees at this level are expected to independently determine eligibility for multiple public assistance programs, provide basic employment services, and perform integrated case management. Positions in this class are flexibly staffed and are normally filled by advancement from the lower level of Integrated Case Worker I, or if filled from the outside, require prior related experience.

Example Skills and Duties:

- Interview clients to ascertain employability, isolate barriers to employment, evaluate need for public assistance and determine benefit eligibility.
- Perform case studies to assess problems and develop appropriate types and methods of meeting client needs.
- Analyze financial, employment, family, and personal information to determine and authorize initial or continuing eligibility for multiple aid programs.
- Identify clients with existing or potential social behavioral, mental health, substance abuse, or other substantial barriers to employment for referral to other department staff or community resources.
- Handle crisis situations by authorizing benefits within specific guidelines or make appropriate referrals to other staff and community resources for immediate services and assistance.
- Interpret and explain policies, rules and regulations to clients.
- Use a computer to input client information through an automated system.
- Organize and manage client caseload, taking required action within specific time limits established by regulation and local policy.
- Understand and apply methods and procedures for mitigation/reduction of barriers to employment.
- Communicate clear and accurate information regarding clients, both orally and in writing.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with fellow employees, clients and public.



WORK INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT

Updated Reimbursement of 50% of Wages to Employers

Are you an employer looking for help? The specific technical skills you need may be hard to find. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) On-the-Job Training Program helps you train the right workers to meet your requirements.

This program assists employers with the costs of hiring and training new and advancing employees by offering financial reimbursement of up to 50% of the employee's wages during the training period.
